

















Clinical pilot results

We have the potential to unlock a 30% reduction in healthcare expenditure costs.






How stress increases the risk to have premature labor*














High levels
of stress
produces
cortisol + cytokines.

Transplacental transport to the fetus.

Enters the fetal circulation.

Induced effects on placental
physiology, affecting the thymus, that has
effects on the inflammatory immune response.

Exposure to glucocorticoids in utero due to maternal psychosocial stress during pregnancy, may program immune function of the developing organism, resulting in life-long alterations.
